GOJ Releases Diplomatic Bluebook 2024

On Tuesday, **Minister for Foreign Affairs Kamikawa Yoko** presented the **2024 Diplomatic Bluebook** to the Cabinet.

The document expresses "serious concern" for Chinese foreign policy and military activities, while reviving for the first time in five years the terminology, "mutually beneficial relationship based on common strategic interests."

It states that Japan is in the most severe and complex situation in the post-war period in the face of multiple security challenges and that the international community faces a "historic turning point" amid two regional wars.

The document points out that this year will be critical for international affairs given multiple national elections and that the wars in Europe and the Middle East are hindering international cooperation.

It positions **South Korea as a** "partner" for the first time in fourteen years.

Inaugural Japan-ROK-U.S. Trilateral Finance Ministers' Meeting

On Wednesday, Minister of Finance Suzuki Shunichi attended the inaugural finance ministers' meeting with his counterparts from South Korea and the United States in Washington, D.C.

The trilateral meeting was agreed upon at the Camp David Summit between Prime Minister Kishida Fumio, U.S. President Joe Biden, and South Korean President Yoon Suk-yeol.

The joint statement issued after the meeting included an unprecedented message acknowledging the "serious concerns" of Japan and South Korea about the recent sharp depreciation of the yen and won. Since the beginning of April, the yen fell to a thirty-four year low of ¥154 to the dollar, while the won has dropped to \#1,400 to the dollar.
